At that price, however, HealthCheck's Skin Growth Monitoring System is still cheaper than an appointment with **Spencer**. It has a magnifying glass, a tool to size your moles, a color chart to check their tint, and a series of body maps and charts to record any changes.

■ **PLUSES:** It's simple. "And maybe if people pay for it, they'll use it," says **Spencer**.

■ **PITFALLS:** Unless you're a contortionist, you'll need a partner to examine your back, which is where most men get melanomas. (Women usually get them on their legs.)
